POLY'S MISSION

Poly's mission is to prepare and inspire the next diverse generation of leaders and global citizens to act with intelligence, imagination, and—above all—character.

THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY 2022–2023

Poly Prep is an academically rigorous co-educational country day school of 1,150 students. The school's 25-acre campus in the Dyker Heights section of Brooklyn, in operation since 1917, includes students in grades five through twelve with a current enrollment of 898. Our Lower School in Park Slope has 252 children enrolled from nursery to fourth grade. The school's population reflects the great urban diversity of Brooklyn and New York City. Approximately 47% of our students are children of color. Central to our educational mission is to prepare students to work and cooperate successfully in a pluralistic community. The size of the graduating class of 2023 will be 140. Poly Prep does not provide class rank. Typically, 100% of Poly Prep graduates attend four-year colleges. For the year 2021–22, Poly returned to indoor and in-person classes for 100% of the student body.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to enroll in at least six courses every term through to graduation. Each student must fulfill the following requirements:

- 4 years of English
- 4 years of Mathematics
- 3 years of History
- 3 years of Science
- 3 consecutive years of the same Classical or World Language (with Level III completion)
- 5 semesters of Arts, including a visual art, music, and public-speaking course (Note: Certain students elect to specialize in a Performing Arts Pathway or a Visual Arts Pathway to complete this requirement)
- 4 years of Physical Education
- 1 semester of Computer Science/Technology
- 1 semester of Health
- 1 semester of Philosophy (grade 12)
- Senior Plan (Capstone research course for all grade 12 students)

ADVANCED COURSES

As of the 2022–23 academic year, Poly is no longer offering A.P. courses. Our new advanced curriculum does not adhere to College Board A.P. curriculum or culminate in A.P. exams. The class of 2023 therefore has some advanced work prior to Grade 12 labeled as A.P. on their transcripts, but in Grade 12 the letters “A.P.” do not appear.

Advanced courses, including those using the A.P. curriculum in prior years, are offered in all departments. They are denoted on Class of 2023 transcripts as either “Advanced”, “Adv”, or “A.P.”

PARAMETERS OF ADVANCED STUDY

Students are leveled in their first two years of Upper School and may be enrolled by the school in advanced courses in languages, math, and science. In Grades 11 and 12 their advanced course load is a product of their individual passions, ambition, and aptitude, and decided in consultation among each student, their academic advisors, and faculty. Therefore, the number of Upper Advanced Courses (those taken in Grades 11 and 12) is the best indicator of rigor in a student’s academic path.

Average number of Upper Advanced Courses taken by the Class of 2023: 3.62

Curricular Rigor Scale—Upper Advanced Courses Per Student in the Class of 2023:

- 8+ – Beyond most demanding curriculum – 14 students
- 5.5-7.5 – Most demanding curriculum – 28 students
- 3-5 – Very demanding curriculum – 36 students
- 2.5 or fewer – Demanding curriculum – 62 students

Certain advanced courses are limited as follows:

- Advanced History Seminars are not available to Grade 12 students in the second semester
- Advanced Calculus II, Linear Algebra, and Advanced Physics classes are only available to Grade 12 students except in highly unusual circumstances

OTHER ADVANCED WORK

Visual and Performing Arts: Students may be designated as advanced in performance ensembles. Concert Choir, Concert Band, and Dance all have advanced levels. Jazz Band is also considered advanced, as it is audition-based and requires a high level of musicianship. Studio Art classes also have advanced levels: semester classes such as Drawing Practices II and Advanced Digital Photography require department approval, as does the full year Advanced Drawing and Painting Portfolio class.

Accelerated Math: In addition to advanced math classes, accelerated level classes have been offered for the first time this year to students performing exceptionally well in our non-advanced curriculum. Transcripts for the class of 2023 may also include an accelerated math class in Grade 12.

Science Research: Science Research is a multi-year commitment beginning in Grade 10 or 11 involving independent research projects mentored by internal and outside faculty and culminating in presentations and science fair competition. Science Research is undertaken in addition to core science courses, not in place of them, and occupies an additional place in both semesters of a student’s schedule.

Independent Studies: Students can propose to work individually with a faculty member to pursue a subject not in the curriculum and/or not able to fit in their daily schedule. Examples of recent Independent Studies include Photography, French Literature, and Creative Writing.

Excellence in the Arts: Students with exceptional levels of course rigor, participation, leadership, service, and accomplishment in the arts will graduate with a certificate of excellence in the arts, which is indicated on their final transcript.

POLY PREP’S REPORTING POLICY ON THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

Students are expected to be honest in their communications to colleges and universities. Poly Prep and/or the student reports suspensions and expulsions that occur while a student is enrolled in grades nine through twelve to colleges and universities to which the student applies. When a suspension or expulsion occurs after college applications have been submitted, Poly Prep and/or the student informs colleges and universities about the change in the student’s status.
